St Mary's College, Auckland: Madison McQuoid was selected for the New Zealand Trampoline Team and received a silver medal in the Individual Trampoline event. Maiya Christini was selected for the New Zealand Secondary Schools' Cross Country Team to compete at the Australian Champs in September. Sophie Magasiva and Heleana McNaught have both been selected to play for the New Zealand U14 Water Polo team. Gracyn Tomuli-Afoa was named captain of the U14 New Zealand basketball team. Chantelle Conroy and Aimee Cogger were both members of the New Zealand U19 Water Polo Team who beat France in their first match. At the New Zealand National Age Group Swimming Championships Kyla Alexander won a gold medal in the 50m backstroke. Azaria Ieriko is a member of the dance crew 'Bubblegum' - they are the reigning New Zealand Junior Dance Crew Champions and have qualified to compete in San Diego in August. Mellata Tatola won a gold medal for shot put and a silver medal for the discus at an Athletics Meet in Sydney.
